

COVID-19 SELF-DECLARATION
AREAS RESERVED FOR PIRELLI GUESTS

I, THE UNDERSIGNED (NAME and SURNAME)

INVITEE AT THE "P ZERO EXPERIENCE ITALIA" EVENT ON 12 – 13 JUNE 2021

**UNDER MY OWN RESPONSIBILITY AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LEGISLATION
IN FORCE, DECLARE THE FOLLOWING:**

- 1) I have not been under health monitoring and fiduciary isolation;
- 2) Prior to entering the area reserved for Pirelli's guests, I measured my own body temperature and it was lower than 37.3°C;
- 3) I have not experienced any of the following symptoms: cough, difficulty breathing, cold, sore throat, headache, severe asthenia (fatigue), decreased or loss in sense of smell/taste, diarrhoea;
- 4) I have not been in close contact with a person with COVID-19 or the symptoms mentioned in 3) above in the last 14 days;
- 5) *(tick as applicable)*
 - **I have not travelled to** Croatia, Greece, Malta and/or Spain or one of the other countries listed in Annex 20 of Italian Prime Ministerial Decree (DPCM) of 07/08/2020, categories C, D, E, F (see reverse) or in locations cited by the authorities to have active COVID-19 outbreaks.
 - **I have not travelled to** Croatia, Greece, Malta and/or Spain or one of the other countries listed in Annex 20 of Italian Prime Ministerial Decree (DPCM) of 07/08/2020, categories C, D, E, F (see reverse) or in locations cited by the authorities to have active COVID-19 outbreaks and have carried out antigen/molecular tests (mandatory for the countries listed in Italian Prime Ministerial Decree of 07/08/2020) and received negative results before having access to Pirelli sites.

Limitations and obligations for re-entry into Italy in accordance with DPCM 07/08/2020 and ORDER OF THE ITALIAN MINISTER OF HEALTH 12/08/2020

With regards to entry into Italy, the new Italian Prime Ministerial Decree (DPCM) of 7 August 2020 identifies, in Annex 20, 6 lists of countries for which various limitations are envisaged.

A - San Marino and Vatican City: no limitations.

B - EU COUNTRIES (except Croatia, Greece, Malta, Spain, Romania and Bulgaria), SCHENGEN area, United Kingdom and Northern Ireland, Andorra, Principality of Monaco: travel to/from EU countries (except Romania and Bulgaria) is permitted without a specific reason and therefore also for TOURISM purposes, without the requirement to isolate upon return. However, the obligation to fill in a self-declaration remains.

Croatia, Greece, Malta, Spain: the Italian Minister of Health established, by the Order dated 12 August 2020 and in addition to existing restrictions for EU countries, that any persons entering/returning to Italy from these countries (after travel or even transit) from 13 August and until further notice, must also:

(a) present proof of having taken an antigen or molecular swab test within 72 hours before entry into the Italian territory and having received a negative result;

or

(b) undergo an antigen or molecular swab test upon arrival at the airport, port or border location (where possible) or within 48 hours of entering Italian territory at the relevant local health authority.

Persons who have stayed in or been in transit via these four Countries must also notify the Prevention Department of the relevant health authority of their entry into the Italian territory.

C - Bulgaria and Romania: travel for any reason whatsoever from/to these Countries is allowed, but upon return to Italy, fiduciary isolation and health monitoring are required, a self-declaration must be filled in and you are instructed to travel to your final destination within Italy via private transportation (airport transit is permitted within the dedicated areas of the airport).

D - Australia, Canada, Georgia, Japan, New Zealand, Rwanda, Republic of Korea, Thailand, Tunisia, Uruguay: travel to/from these countries is permitted without a specific reason and therefore also for TOURISM purposes. However, when you return to Italy, you must undergo fiduciary isolation and health monitoring, complete a self-declaration and you may only travel to your final destination within Italy via private transportation (airport transit is permitted within the dedicated areas of the airport).

E - Rest of the world: travel to/from the rest of the world is only allowed for specific reasons, such as work, health or studies, extreme urgency, return to domicile, home or residence; travel for tourism is therefore not permitted. Returning to Italy from this group of countries is always allowed for Italian/EU/Schengen citizens and their family members, as well as regular residence permit holders and their family members. However, when returning to Italy from these countries, you must undergo fiduciary isolation and health monitoring, complete a self-declaration with details as to the reason for returning, and you may only travel to your final destination within Italy via private transportation (airport transit is permitted within the dedicated areas of the airport).

F - Armenia, Bahrain, Bangladesh, Bosnia Herzegovina, Brazil, Chile, Kuwait, North Macedonia, Moldova, Oman, Panama, Peru, Dominican Republic, Kosovo, Montenegro, Serbia, Colombia: there is currently a ban on entry into Italy from these countries, with the exception of EU citizens (including Italian citizens) and family members thereof who have been registered in Italy since before 9 July 2020. However, when returning to Italy from these countries, you must undergo fiduciary isolation and health monitoring, complete a self-declaration with details as to the reason for returning (possession of EU/Schengen citizenship or family member of an EU citizen and residence within Italy) and you may only travel to your final destination within Italy via private transportation (airport transit is permitted within the dedicated areas of the airport).

P ZERO™ EXPERIENCE 2021 – MUGELLO CIRCUIT INFORMATION ON THE PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

in accordance with article 13 of EU Regulation no. 679/2016 - General Data Protection Regulation ("GDPR")

In order to prevent contagion from COVID-19 and in compliance with the provisions of the "Shared protocol for regulating and containing the spread of the COVID-19 virus in workplaces" signed on 14 March 2020 between the employers' and trade union organisations and supplemented on 24 April 2020¹, we inform you that it will be mandatory for all individuals who, for any reason whatsoever, require access to the P ZERO™ Experience Event, organised by Pirelli Tyre S.p.A. at the Mugello Circuit (hereinafter the "Circuit"), on 12 and

13 June 2021, to have their body temperature taken and sign a declaration confirming that they have not been in contact with individuals who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days.

The legal basis for such processing is the implementation of anti-contagion security protocols pursuant to Article 1 (7), letter d) of the DPCM of 11 March 2020.

WE THEREFORE INFORM YOU THAT, BEFORE YOU ENTER THE CIRCUIT

- a) YOUR BODY TEMPERATURE WILL BE MEASURED by authorised and specially trained personnel, and
- b) authorised personnel will ask you to complete and sign a declaration stating that you have not been in contact with persons who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 14 days.

Once you enter the refreshment areas (hereinafter referred to as 'Refreshment Areas'), your body temperature will be measured again.

The data contained in the declaration and data from temperature measurements will be used for the sole purpose of allowing or denying you access to the Circuit and the Refreshment Areas.

The original copy of your declaration will be retained as proof of issuance, while temperature measurement data will be taken in real time and will not be recorded.

This is without prejudice to the need to retain certain information in order to substantiate potential refusal to grant access due to (i) no signed self-declaration or (ii) exceeding the permitted temperature.

Failure to access will only be noted in such cases.

The data collected will be: (i) in the case of no signed self-declaration, surname, name, company (if applicable) or date and (ii) in the case of detection of temperature which is above the prescribed threshold, surname, name, date and time of detection.

This personal data, for purposes set out herein, will be retained until the end of the state of emergency and, during such period, may only be known by the authorised staff of the companies which, as Data Controllers, are entrusted with the task of facilitating surveillance and security activities; such data will not be disclosed to third parties.

The Data Controller is Pirelli Tyre S.p.A.
